Chanukah: Appreciating The Light

When trying to understand the true nature of Chanukah we often struggle to comprehend why so much prominence is given to the miracle of the *PACH SHEMEN*/cruse of oil (we light the Menorah, eat foods that are made with oil) and yet the military victory over the Syrian Greeks is only mentioned in our additional paragraph of *BI'MEY MATISYAHU* (inserted after *MODIM* in *SHMONA ESREI*). We would all agree that the miracle of the oil is amazing – but doesn't overcoming a superpower deserve a little more attention?

Rav Chaim Shmulevitz zt'l the Rosh Yeshiva of the famed Mirrer Yeshiva explains this dynamic. In reality there are different types of miracles. There are miracles that are necessary to remedy an immediate need. For example, when the Jewish people left Egypt and found themselves stuck between the Red Sea and the pursuing Egyptian Army - there is "no choice" - God must split the sea to save His nation. However, there is another non-utilitarian type of miracle. A miracle that is performed not because there is any particular need that must be addressed - rather, a miracle that is performed to send a message. An example of this second type of miracle can be found in last week's Parsha. Yosef's brothers sell him to a group of traveling merchants. The Torah goes out of its way to tell us that the caravan was transporting sweet-smelling, aromatic herbs and spices. The Talmud explains that generally, these types of caravans carried foul-smelling hides and oils. This was a miraculous event orchestrated by God for the benefit of Yosef. Are we to understand that because Yosef is surrounded by potpourri that suddenly his suffering and anxiety melt away? Of course not — but the message being dispatched to Yosef was — you are not alone. I know you are hurt, I know you are broken but I am here with you. In other words, Yosef received a Divine kiss (NESHIKA). A kiss of reassurance, love and companionship. This explains Ray Shmulevitz is the essence of the PACH SHEMEN (cruse of oil) miracle. God did not need to do it; it was not "necessary"; we could have easily gotten by without it. This is what makes it so special - it was a "kiss" from God to us. It was a kiss that reflected His pride and admiration for the sacrifices we were willing to make. It was a kiss that reminded us that even when life is dark and difficult, we are never alone. It was a kiss that gave us the strength to weather the difficulties and vicissitudes of life.

Now we can understand why this miracle takes center stage on Chanukah. The *PACH SHEMEN* is much more than a jug of oil – it is the kiss that has held us through the centuries, it is the kiss that dispels the darkness, it is the kiss is that gives us the strength to get back up when life has knocked us down.

The kiss of the PACH SHEMEN will allow us to find the strength and find positive ways to respond to the current tragedy in Israel.

The kiss of the PACH SHEMEN is the kiss that opens our eyes, and provides the illumination to see all of the other Divine "kisses" we experience throughout life.

As we bask in the glow of the Menorah over the remaining nights of Chanukah, let us remember the kisses of the past appreciate the kisses of the present and yearn to be showered with Divine Kisses in the near future.
